

AAFP Immunization Survey 2008

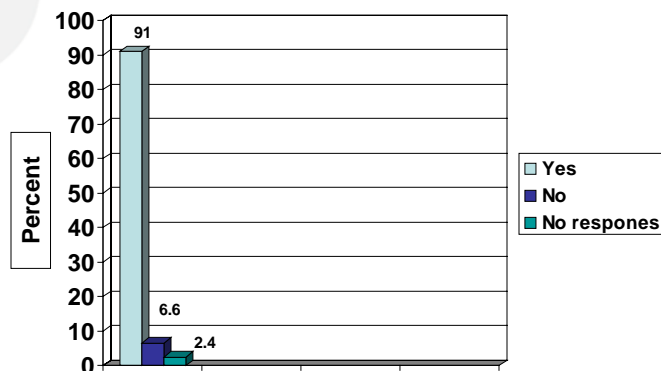
- The American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) conducted an annual survey (2004-2009) on immunization practices of family physicians.
- The surveys were completed as part of a Cooperative Agreement with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- In 2008, a random sample of 2000 AAFP members who spend 80% or more of their time in direct patient care were surveyed.
- The random sample included family physicians from all 50 states and the District of Columbia.
- The 2008 immunization survey and responses served as the basis of this study.

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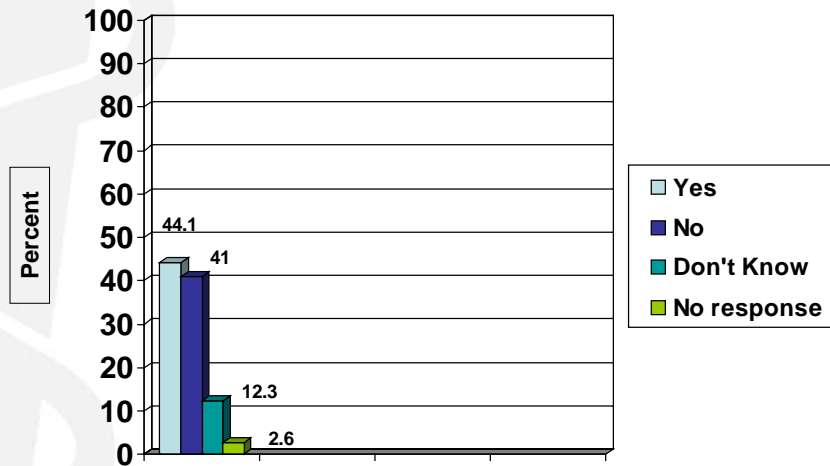
Question #1: For the 2007-2008 influenza season, did your practice give the influenza vaccine? (n=708)



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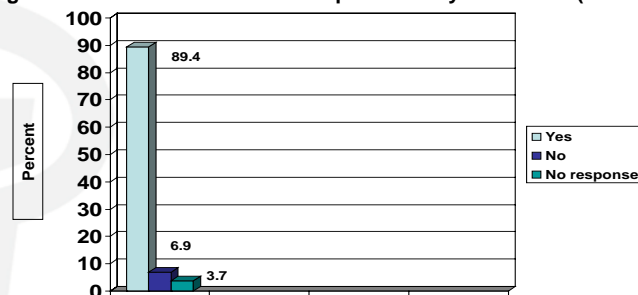
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Question #2: Did you have influenza vaccine left-over from the 2007-2008 influenza season? (n=644)

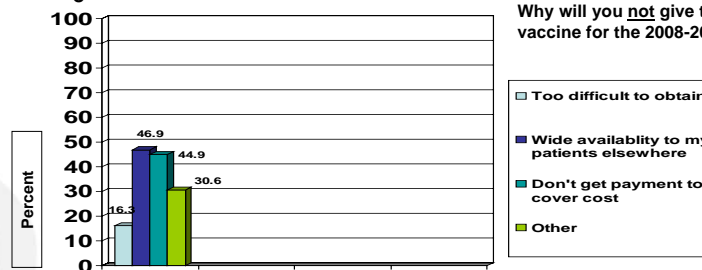


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Question # 3: For the 2008-2009 influenza season, do you plan to give influenza immunizations to patients in your office? (n=708)



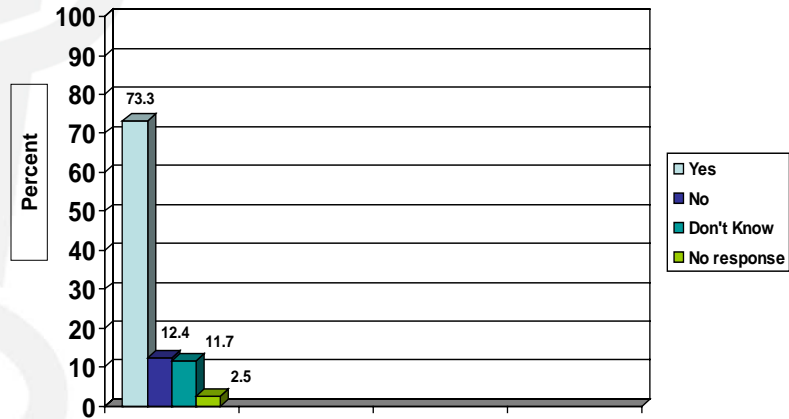
Why will you not give the influenza vaccine for the 2008-2009 season?



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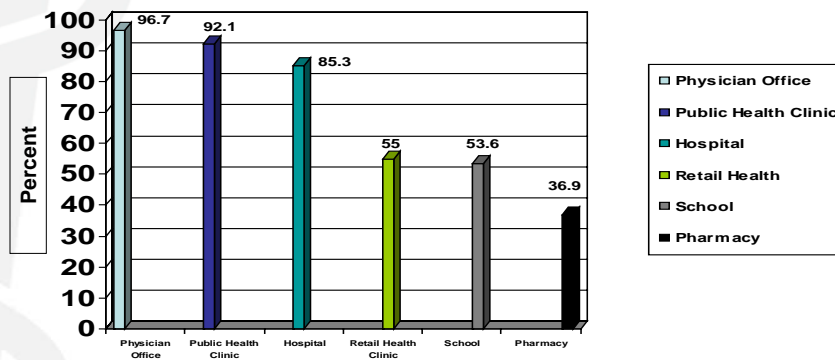

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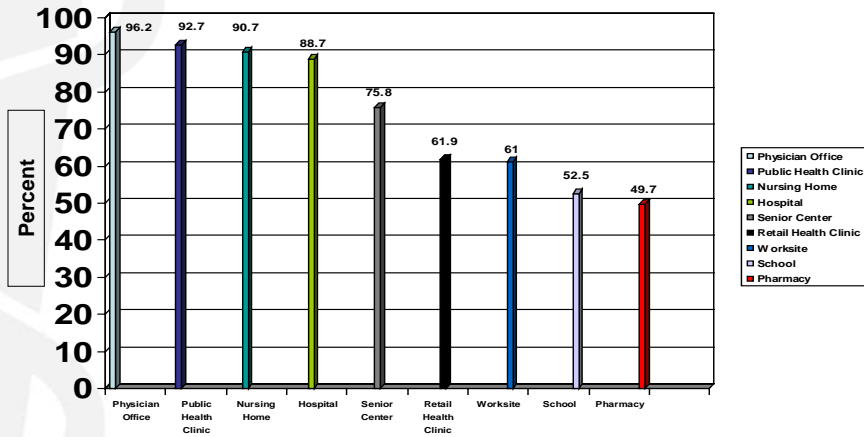
Question #9: In your opinion, what are acceptable sites for administration of influenza vaccine for children and adolescents? (n=707)



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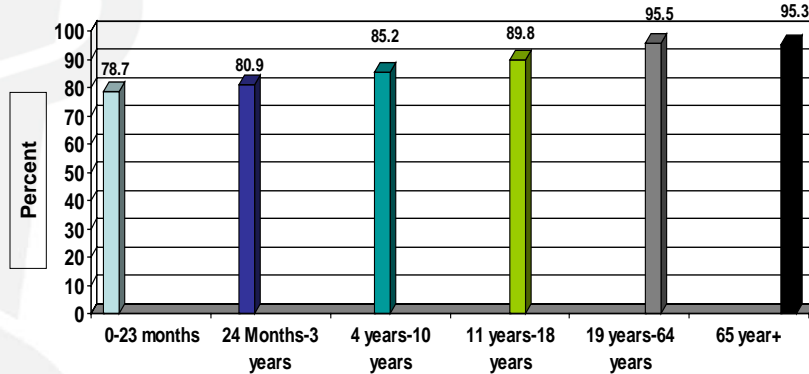
Question #10: In your opinion, what are acceptable sites for administration of influenza vaccine for adults? (n=708)



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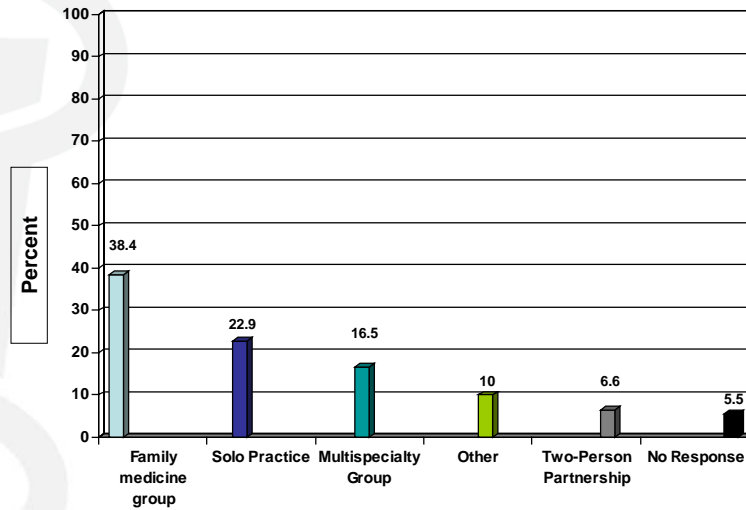
Question #19: Check the age groups from whom your practice providers care (Check all that apply) (n=708)
