Background

- Vaccines for uninsured and underinsured children are covered by the Vaccines for Children Program
- No federal program exists to cover uninsured and underinsured adults



Background

- Goal of new program is to stabilize vaccine availability while taking into account continued budged challenges
- Designed to offer consistency in clinic participation and to enable local flexibility regarding population served
- 3 year program (January 2011-September 2013)
- Vaccine (not money) awarded to selected facilities




Clinic Selection


- Requested applications from any clinic or organization that regularly sees uninsured or underinsured adults
- Clinic Prerequisites
 - Must already regularly immunize uninsured and underinsured adults
 - Must be a safety net organization for uninsured and underinsured adults
- Open to any kind of organization or provider
- Received over 160 applications requesting a total of \$10 million of vaccine over the three year period




UUAV Clinics

- 109 clinics (156 total sites) selected and awarded vaccine
 - Selected facilities include local public health, community clinics, Tribal Health/IHS, correctional facilities, FQHCs, RHCs, school located clinics, private clinics
- Selection Criteria included:
 - Duration of the organization's current adult immunization program
 - · Percentage of uninsured and underinsured adult patients
 - · Planned outreach to the broader community
 - · Geographic representation to assure a more even distribution










UUAV Program


- Year One (2011)
 - Offered Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, HPV, MCV4, MMR, PPSV23, Td, Tdap, Varicella
 - · 46% of doses ordered
- Year Two (2012)
 - · Added Influenza
 - · 64% if doses ordered
- Year Three (2013)
 - Added Zoster
 - · 20% of doses ordered (so far)


