Medicaid

- Federal/state funded health insurance for the lowest income individuals
- Every state, DC, 5 Territories participate in Medicaid
- 2012 adult enrollees (ages 19 through 64): 19 million
 - 11million live in 10 states:
 - California, New York, Florida, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Ohio, Illinois, Texas, Massachusetts, Tennessee
- 2017 adult enrollees: 31 million ¹
- Coverage for immunizations for adults is optional. States determine:
 - · Which (if any) vaccines to cover
 - · Enrollee copayment policy
 - Provider reimbursement policy
 - · Settings where vaccines may be administered

4 ACA Provisions Important to Medicaid & Adult Immunizations

PROVISION 1:


Programs may expand Medicaid eligibility to include adults with income at or below 133% FPL

2014 FPL + 33% = \$15,521 single, \$31,720 family of 4

4 ACA Provisions Important to Medicaid & Adult Immunizations

EXPANSION STATES (n=27)

PROVISION 2:

MUST provide **benchmark** coverage to newly eligible enrollees (as of 01/01/14)

PROVISION 3:

Adult enrollees who qualify through traditional eligibility categories (before 01/01/14): Coverage for immunization is optional

PROVISION 4:

MAY cover all recommended adult vaccines + prohibit costsharing = 1% increase Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP)

• FMAP = federal contribution individual states receive to support Medicaid


