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Dr. Alexander is senior medical director for Amerigroup Georgia, a wholly owned subsidiary of WellPoint, Inc. In this role, he oversees the health care needs of the membership and serves as the principal medical manager and policy advisor to the health plan.

Dr. Alexander is a member of the Infant Mortality Task Force of the Georgia Department of Public Health, the Georgia Maternal Mortality Review Committee and the Advisory Board of the Institute of Health Administration, Robinson College of Business, Georgia State University.
