In her capacity at the American College of Physicians, Dr. Hall established both offices and leads the development, implementation, and evaluation of quality improvement initiatives including a QI network nationwide. Adult immunization has been a core focus of the Center for Quality since its launch. Prior to joining the ACP, Dr. Hall directed strategic educational initiatives at the American College of Cardiology. Programs developed and implemented by Dr. Hall included an *in situ* simulation educational program in acute STEMI care, *credo* – Coalition to Reduce Disparities in CV Outcomes, and two multi-year, multi-million dollar PI-CME initiatives in acute coronary syndromes and atrial fibrillation.

Dr. Hall previously served as the scientific director at an educational firm and the deputy director of the NAMI - National Alliance for the Mentally Ill. She was a senior health analyst for the U.S. Congress, in the Office of Technology Assessment before that, after receiving her Ph.D. in neuroscience from the Naval Medical School (Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences) and served as a post-doctoral fellow at the National Institutes of Health and the Bloomberg School of Public Health at Johns Hopkins University. Dr. Hall has authored more than 4 dozen articles, book chapters, and books and presented in multiple professional forums. She resides in Severna Park, MD with her husband, the Rev. Dr. John Price, daughter, 16 year old Isabella Pazaryna, and, when not away at college, 20 year old son Henry Pazaryna.
