Dr. Murray is a University of Michigan Medical School graduate. He completed pediatric residency at Children's Hospital of Northern California and pediatric infectious diseases fellowship at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. Dr. Murray was on the faculty at Michigan State University's Department of Pediatrics and Human Development from 1979-2001 before moving to the Medical College of Georgia (now GRU).

Dr. Murray has been a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) since 1979 and has served on both the AAP's Committee on Infectious Diseases (from 1995 to 2001 and again from 2011-present) and the Section on Infectious Diseases (SOID) Executive Committee (2006-present). He has been the Chair of the SOID since 2010. Dr. Murray is a member of the Pediatric Infectious Disease Society and the American Pediatric Society, and has also worked with CMS, and AHRQ on hospitalization issues related to both quality and infectious diseases in children's care. His research interests include vaccines and vaccine safety, viral diseases and infections in child care.

Dr. Murray has served on the Immunization Expert Technical Panel for the CMS and American Public Health Association's *National Health and Safety Performance Standards for Out of Home Child Care*. He has given over 190 Scientific and CME presentations and is an author of > 150 peer-reviewed articles, book chapters, commentaries, and other published materials.
