Challenges

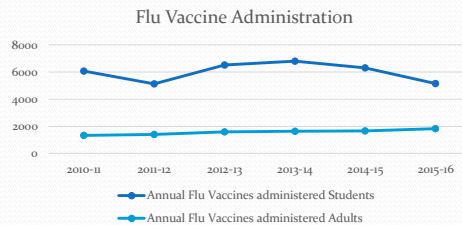
- Vaccine availability

What was the end result?

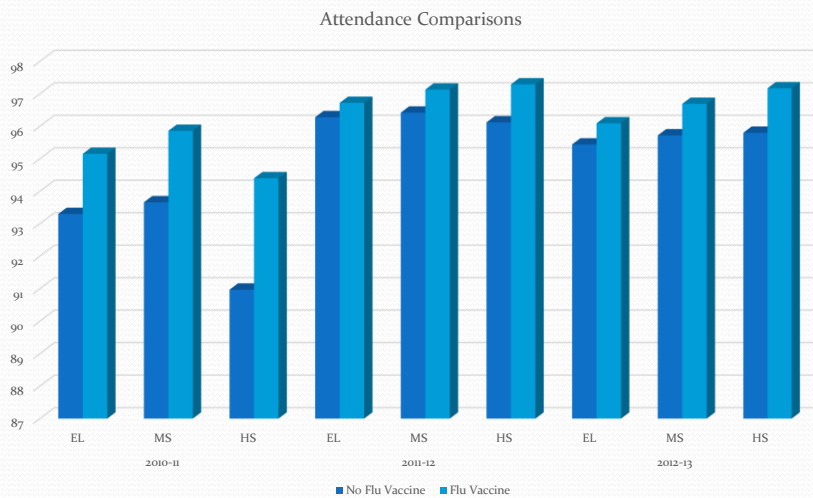
- 10,010 flu vaccines administered to students and staff
- Little disruption to education
- Improved attendance
- Demonstrated vaccine safety – flu mist
- Increased parental support
- Increased community support and partners

Flu Vaccines administered

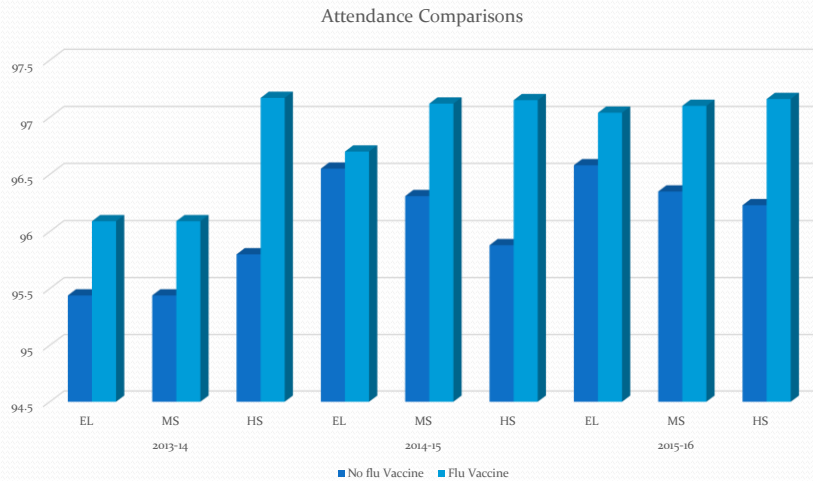
- 2010- 2016 Average= 6,000 Students
- 2010- 2016 Average= 1,600 Staff

Recommendations

- Conduct School Vaccination Clinics
- Involve key community stakeholders
- **Funding sources**
- Scheduling – during school, after school, weekend
- Educate parents, faculty and community
- Vaccine storage, staffing
- Obtain parental consent

- Record keeping and documentation
- Data analysis
