Dave Daigle is the Associate Director for Communication in CDC's Office of Public Health Preparedness and Response (OPHPR). OPHPR leads the agency's preparedness and response activities by providing strategic direction, support, and coordination for activities across CDC as well as with local, state, tribal, national, territorial, and international public health partners.

Before joining OPHPR, Mr. Daigle was the deputy director of CDC's Division of Media Relations and a senior press officer for the National Center for Infectious Diseases. He has responded to multiple public health emergencies including the SARS, West Nile Virus, Hurricane Katrina, Haiti for the earthquake and cholera, and most recently for Ebola in Nigeria, Dallas, NYC, and Sierra Leone. He was named "Spokesperson of the Year" by *PR News* in 2014.

Before working at CDC, Mr. Daigle was a tank officer in the U.S. Army. He was also an English professor, public affairs officer and journal editor for *Armor*, the professional journal of the U.S. Army's Armor Branch.

Mr. Daigle received a MA in English from Michigan State University and a BA in journalism from Loyola University New Orleans.
