Laura Lee Hall joined ACP in 2011, founding the Center for Quality and Office of Grants. The Center for Quality is built around a national network of QI champions—ACP Quality Connect—with programming in 18 states and a focus on adult immunization, diabetes, and chronic pain. The Center for Quality also has developed and manages several registries that assist ACP members and health care teams implement practice transformation and improvement, while satisfying meaningful use, reimbursement, and professional reporting requirements.

Dr. Hall has over 20 years of experience leading health education, research, and advocacy efforts for government, for-profit, and nonprofit setting. After receiving a PhD at the Naval Medical School (USUHS) and completing post-doctoral fellowships at the NIH and Bloomberg School of Public Health at John Hopkins University, she worked as a senior analyst at the congressional Office of Technology Assessment. She then became the deputy director of the National Alliance for the Mentally Ill, leading advocacy, education, communications, and research efforts on behalf of individuals with serious mental illness. After serving as an advisor to the director of the National Institute of Mental Health and as the scientific director at INNOVIA Education she led the development and implementation of major quality improvement and educational programs at the American College of Cardiology, including the development and launch of credo--Coalition to Reduce Ethnic and Racial Disparities in Cardiovascular Disease Outcomes.

Dr. Hall is married to the Reverend Dr. John Randolph Price, with whom she resides in Severna Park, MD. She is the proud mom of college students Henry and Isabella Pazaryna.
