Dr. Hall received bachelors (BSPH, Highest Honors, 1999) and masters (MSPH, 2001) degrees from the School of Public Health at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a doctorate of veterinary medicine (DVM, 2006) from North Carolina State University. Following completion of academic and clinical training, Dr. Hall joined the Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS) of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and was assigned to the state health department of West Virginia.

In 2008, Dr. Hall joined the CDC Division of Viral Diseases to lead and expand the norovirus epidemiology program. In that capacity, he has developed domestic and international surveillance initiatives, led outbreak investigations, and served as principal investigator on numerous prospective research projects. Dr. Hall also leads the agency efforts on Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) issues at the animal-human interface. He is a recognized expert in the field, providing consultation within CDC, to state and local health departments, federal regulatory agencies, advisory committees, and international partners.

Dr. Hall has authored over 100 journal articles and book chapters, has an adjunct faculty appointment at the Rollins School of Public Health of Emory University and is board certified as a diplomate in the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine (ACVPM).
