CAPT Thomas Weiser, MD, MPH

Portland Area Indian Health Service (IHS)



CAPT. Weiser is the Medical Epidemiologist for the Portland Area IHS assigned to the Northwest Portland Area Indian Health Board and NW Tribal Epidemiology Center. He has been with PHS since 1998, initially serving as an IHS Medical Officer in Whiteriver, Arizona from 1998-2005. He completed the CDC Epidemic Intelligence Service from 2005-2007, assigned to the Missouri Dept. of Health and Senior Services. In 2007, he began his current position. In addition to supporting epidemiology and research at the NW Tribal Epidemiology Center, Dr. Weiser is also the Co-Chair of the Portland Area IHS Institutional Review Board, which is responsible for reviewing research projects throughout the Portland Area.

CAPT. Weiser completed his medical studies at the State University of New York, Brooklyn and his residency in Family and Community Medicine at the University of California, Davis. He also earned his Master of Public Health degree from the University of California, Los Angeles, focusing on infectious disease epidemiology.

Jillian Doss-Walker, MPH

Indian Health Service (IHS), Immunization Program



Jillian Doss-Walker is a Public Health Advisor with the CDC Immunizations Services Division, and is assigned to the IHS, Immunization Program where she is currently serving as the Interim IHS Immunization Program Manager. She has been working with IHS since 2016 and has been with CDC since 2007.

In her current role, she provides subject matter expertise and technical assistance to IHS, CDC, tribes, state immunization programs, and other partners to support the delivery of immunizations to American Indian and Alaska Native people. This includes activities to strengthen and enhance state and tribal immunization program partnerships, implementing vaccine policies and recommendations, and conducting education and training to various partners and providers.

Lynsey Kimmins is a Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR), Michigan's immunization information system, Epidemiologist with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Division of Immunization.
