Michigan Primary Care Association (MPCA)

- Today, the MPCA:
 - Is the voice of **45 CHC Organizations** that provide primary and preventive health care
 - Serves more than **700,000 patients** in rural and urban communities
 - Has more than 270 delivery sites
- Mission: To enhance integrated care through CHCs while influencing policy at the state and national level.
- Vision: Quality, integrated care for all.



MPCA & MDHHS Division of Immunization Partnership History

- Previously, the division funded a fulltime-contracted position at MPCA (~2000-2013)
 - Assisted MPCA member health center immunization programs
 - FQHCs, Look-Alikes, Migrants, Native American Tribal Health Centers, School-based and School-linked health centers
 - Served as a liaison between MDHHS and health centers
 - Provided programmatic, technical, and logistical assistance
 - Focused primarily on child and adolescent immunizations
- Combination of retirement, funding, and position challenges lead to the elimination of this position in 2013



MPCA & MDHHS Division of Immunization

Renewing the Partnership with the 2015 PPHF Adult Immunization Standards Grant

- MDHHS invited 25 organization to participate in grant activities with stipend
 - 18 accepted
 - Stipend provided an incentive, motivation, and accountability
- MPCA & MDHHS Division of Immunization Grant Kick-off Meeting
 - New leadership and program personnel at MPCA
 - New focus on adult immunizations
 - Established new goals and reinvigorated the partnership



MPCA & MDHHS Division of Immunization

PPHF Adult Immunization Standards Grant Execution

- MPCA was one of the more eager and active participants during the first 2 years of the grant
 - Also requested and received additional funding to do supplemental activities
- Activities during initial grant period included:
 - Stakeholder meeting participation
 - Adult Standard Modules at
 - CHC sites
 - MPCA Annual LGBTQ+ Health Summit
 - MPCA Annual Conference
 - Sponsored member attendance to Michigan Regional Immunization Conferences
 - MDHHS pilot of CHC immunization report cards



CHC Site Level Report Card

- An MDHHS-MPCA resource proposed and created by MDHHS
- Developed and distributed quarterly since January 2017 (2016 Q4)
- Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR) Adult Data
 - Over 7.9 million adult records
 - Incomplete/missing adult data: lifespan registry since in 2006 & adult data reporting is not required
- Report cards include:
 - Vaccine coverages and trends across the lifespan
 - Site level VFC and Michigan Adult Vaccine Program (MI-AVP) reported doses
 - Comparison to Michigan and national estimates along with HP 2020 benchmark data and available performance measures for HEDIS
 - Historical quarter coverage estimate comparison



Common Goal to Reach Underserved (Adult) Populations

Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) Learning Community & QI Director Network

- PCMH Learning Community was a technical assistance initiative developed by MPCA in partnership with a national PCMH expert organization (2011-2012).
 - Combination of virtual and in-person training sessions on PCMH principles
 - Peer-to-peer activity, implementation, and sustainability lessons
- QI Director Network
 - MPCA managed group of health center staff engaged in QI
 - Including PCMH and practice transformation activities



PCMH & Adult Immunizations

- Integrating adult immunizations into the daily huddle for care teams, a core focus of PCMH
- Incorporating adult immunizations (MCIR histories/high risk indicators/conditions) as part of *pre-visit planning (PVP)*
- Reinforces the health center as the *preventive medicine provider* for underserved adults, many of whom are Medicaid beneficiaries



Michigan Quality Improvement Network (MQIN)

- MPCA received a grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to establish and support a Health Center Controlled Network (HCCN). (2016-2019)
- Purpose: Support health centers in achieving meaningful use of ONC-certified electronic health records (EHRs), adopting technology-enabled quality improvement strategies, and engaging in health information exchange (HIE) to strengthen the quality of care and improve patient health outcomes.
- 39 health centers participate


Adult Immunization Quality Improvement (Al-QI) Initiative September 2017- Present



Al-Ql Project Model

- Adapted Plan-Do-Study-Act (PDSA)-style model ("AFIX")
 - Assessment: CHC Site Level Report Cards
 - Feedback: Kick-off visit with organization (1.5 to 2 hrs in-person) & Engagement through MPCA QI Directors Network
 - Incentive: Recognition from MPCA, MDHHS, and Health Center Leadership
 - eXchange: Follow-up visit (3 6 months from kick-off visit) with organization to discuss implementation of selected strategies and share project measures





20 Michigan health center organizations confirmed in the project with 62 Delivery Sites spanning 35 counties and the City of Detroit.

Themes & Successes from the Al-Ql Project

- MCIR Data Cleaning
- Improved workflows to make AI a standard of care for routine assessment of adults, and include in PVP, Huddles, etc.
- Provider and Staff education through INE program, PPEPI program,
 CDC's You Call the Shots and Pink Book Webinars, use of Immunization
 Champion
- Build Awareness and Use of MI-AVP (2 health centers completed training and are now administering public doses)
- Targeted hepatitis A outbreak outreach



MPCA & MDHHS Division of Immunization

Partnership after the 2015 PPHF Adult Immunization Standards Grant

- Finish remaining in-person follow-up visits
- Continue distribution of quarterly CHC Report Cards
- New activities to continue partnership:
 - Conference calls with MPCA, MDHHS, and CHC sites following quarterly report card distribution
 - Provide timely immunization updates
 - Q&A time for open communication
 - Highlight immunization success stories
 - Continue regular email immunization updates to MPCA members
 - Develop unblinded comparison of CHC coverage estimates stratified by population size
- Future activities are being discussed following the grant ending and staff changes
