For the past six years, Ms. Jamison has worked as a project coordinator and qualitative researcher with Dr. Sandra Crouse Quinn on two NIH-funded vaccine-related research projects. This work includes an investigation of emerging trends in vaccine related discourse on social media in the *Supplementing Survey-Based Analyses of Group Vaccination Narratives and Behaviors Using Social Media Project* (NIGMS) and a mixed-methods investigation of racial disparities in adult influenza uptake in the *Uncovering and Addressing Cultural Beliefs in Vaccine Racial Disparities Project* (NIMHD).

In addition to her research on vaccines, Ms. Jamison has worked on projects to improve health equity and protect vulnerable populations on topics including reducing infant mortality, improving access to oral health care, understanding minority participation in genomic research, and reducing stigma among women aging with HIV. She has co-authored 15 peer-reviewed articles on vaccine-related topics, including research articles in *Social Science & Medicine* and the *American Journal of Public Health*.

Ms. Jamison obtained her masters degrees in applied anthropology and epidemiology from the University of Maryland, College Park.
