Commander Tina Objio is a Nurse Educator for the Communication and Education Branch at CDC and a U.S. Public Health Service officer. She began her nursing career as a U.S Air Force nurse in Nevada, where she provided in-patient care on a medical-surgical ward and then post-operative care in a post-anesthesia care unit in a military hospital. In 2009, she was honorably discharged from the Air Force and joined the U.S. Public Health Service later that same year

Commander Objio's first Public Health Service duty assignment was as a clinical nurse in a large federal prison complex in Florida, where she provided a broad range of medical care including management of the annual influenza vaccine campaign for staff and inmates and immunizations for inmates with infectious diseases. In 2013, Commander Objio accepted her first position with CDC, where her work focused on conducting domestic and international airplane contact investigations for diseases such as measles, pertussis, meningococcal disease, tuberculosis, and viral hemorrhagic fevers

In July of 2017, Commander Objio joined the Communication and Education Branch of the Immunization Services Division. She is a member of three Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices workgroups. In her current position, she both presents and provides input for written content that supports national immunization efforts and recommendations made by Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. She has been a registered nurse since 2005.
