Dr. Abramsohn has served as a trusted expert on Medicare and Medicaid policy, federal and state health strategy, and partnerships with private-sector stakeholders. Her work has consistently focused on building durable systems that protect and improve population health.

At IDPN, Dr. Abramsohn leads the organization's efforts to build enduring advocacy infrastructure, mobilize the diverse pro-vaccine community, and strengthen state-level capacity to protect vaccine access for all people. Under her leadership, IDPN coordinates resources, equips advocates, and advances strategic policy initiatives to ensure families and communities remain protected from vaccine-preventable diseases.

She is committed to using her experience in public health policy, partnerships, and organizational leadership to defend access to essential health services—particularly vaccines—and to champion evidence-based policies that safeguard community health.
