Helen Branswell is a senior writer at STAT, covering infectious diseases and global health. Branswell joined STAT at its 2015 launch. Prior to joining STAT, Branswell worked for The Canadian Press, Canada's news agency, where she was CP's medical reporter from 2000 to 2015. During that time she was based in Toronto, where she covered the 2003 SARS-1 outbreak.

Branswell was a Southam Fellow at the University of Toronto in 1992-1993. She was a 2004 CDC Knight Fellow, when she embedded in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for three months. She was a 2011 Nieman Global Health Fellow at Harvard, focusing on polio eradication. She won the 2020 George Polk Award for Public Service for her coverage of the Covid-19 pandemic and with colleagues was a 2020 Pulitzer finalist for breaking news for STAT's Covid coverage. She won the 2021 Victor Cohn Prize for Excellence in Medical Science Reporting. She was awarded a doctor of laws, honoris causa, by Carleton University in Ottawa, Canada in 2022.
