Jason Goldman, M.D., MACP, is Immediate Past President of the American College of Physicians, representing internal medicine physicians, related subspecialists, and medical students.

Dr. Goldman completed medical school at the University of Miami and residency in internal medicine at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, FL. He has managed his own private practice since 2002 and is a Clinical Affiliate Professor of General Internal Medicine in the Department of Medicine at the Florida Atlantic University, Charles E. Schmidt School of Medicine. Prior to managing his own practice, Dr. Goldman worked primarily in hospital medicine as an Attending at both Mt. Sinai Medical Center in Miami Beach and Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami, Florida.

Dr. Goldman became a Fellow of ACP in 2007. Fellowship is an honorary designation that recognizes ongoing individual service and contributions to the practice of medicine. He was subsequently elected to Mastership (MACP) in 2025, which recognizes outstanding and extraordinary contributions to the practice of medicine.

Beyond serving as President, Dr. Goldman has held multiple national and chapter leadership positions within ACP. He was Governor of ACP's Florida Chapter from 2016 to 2020, during which time he was also a member of the Board of Governors and its Executive Committee. Dr. Goldman also served as a member of the Board of Regents from 2020 to 2024.

He has extensive committee and task force service, including as Chair of the Medical Practice and Quality Committee from 2023 to 2024, where he had previously been Vice Chair and a member. He was previously a member of the Governance Committee, the Internal Medicine Scientific Program Committee, the Quality Improvement Learning Collaborative Task Force, and the Professional Accountability Principles Review Task Force. He is currently on the ACP Immunization Committee.

Dr. Goldman has held several prominent advisory and liaison roles related to vaccine policy and immunization. Since 2018, he has been actively involved as ACP liaison to the CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices and as a member of CDC committees and workgroups, including the Pneumonia Vaccine Workgroup, the Immunization Committee, the Adult Vaccine Access Coalition, and the COVID-19 Vaccine Measure Expert Work Group.

He has authored several published case reports and policy papers in addition to receiving numerous honors and awards, including the ACP Richard Neubauer National Advocate for

Internal Medicine in 2018, Florida Chapter Internist of the Year in 2013 and the Laureate Award in 2022.
