Adult Vaccine Access Coalition (AVAC)

- Established in 2015 to strengthen and enhance access to and increase utilization of vaccines among adults.
- AVAC is made up of a diverse group of health care providers, vaccine innovators, public health organizations, patient and consumer groups.



AVAC is fighting to make necessary policy changes to increase vaccination rates — saving lives and money.



Coverage of Vaccines: Commercial


- The Affordable Care Act or "ACA" was the comprehensive health care reform law enacted in March 2010
 - > Makes affordable health insurance available to more people.
 - Expands the Medicaid program to cover all adults with income below 138% of the FPL. Not all states have expanded their Medicaid programs. ACIP-recommended vaccines were included in the Expansion populations
- As part of the ACA (Sec. 2713), most* private health plans must provide coverage for a range of recommended preventive services to individuals without cost-sharing (such as copayments, deductibles, or co-insurance). All ACIPrecommended vaccines are covered under this section



Cost With the new Inflation Reduction Law, now Medicare Part D beneficiaries won't face high out-of-pocket costs for their vaccines. WHAT TO WATCH...

Vaccines are covered in Part B and Part D.

Medicare Part B (physician billing)

- Covid-19, Influenza, Pneumonia and Hepatitis B vaccines
- In Social Security Act. No cost.

Medicare Prescription Drug Coverage (Part D – Pharmacy Billing)


- Shingles, Tetanus-Diphtheria-Whooping Cough, RSV, future vaccines
- Medicare Modernization Act. Passed 2003. New vaccines covered under Part D.
- IRA. Pass 2022. Removed Cost sharing from coverage for ACIP-recommended vaccines under Medicare Part D (Sec. 11401).

Coverage of Vaccines: Medicaid

Medicaid.

- ACIP recommended vaccines available with no out-of-pocket cost.
- Prior to 2023, vaccine coverage and cost sharing differed based on state.
- 2023. Expanded overage for all ACIP Recommended adult vaccines in traditional Medicaid and CHIP programs. (IRA Sec 11405).

WHAT TO WATCH...



Coverage of Vaccines: Uninsured

Adults without insurance may be able to access vaccines through:

- Patient assistance programs
- State/Local Health Deparments.

The CDC Immunization Program funding provides dollars to state and local health for many elements of immunization Infrastructure.

- FY24 \$682m
- FY25 CR (stays the same)
- Allows for some adult vaccine purchase
