Elizabeth Sobczyk has worked across the lifespan in the immunization community for over 17 years. She is currently Project Director for the CDC Cooperative Agreement to Improve Immunization Rates in Post-Acute and Long-Term Care at AMDA – The Society for Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medicine. The project works directly with skilled nursing and assisted living facilities in a quality improvement pilot to understand what works to improve rates among staff and residents. Ms. Sobczyk also leads work at the systems level to understand cost-benefit of a strong immunization program, connect electronic health records to immunization information systems, and develop quality improvement networks for PALTC settings.

Prior to her time at AMDA, Ms. Sobczyk served as Director of Strategic Alliances at The Gerontological Society of America, where she worked with corporate partners on topics such as shared clinical decision making, developing immunization champions, and disease-specific education. She was also the Manager of Immunization Initiatives at the American Academy of Pediatrics for 11 years on topics such as vaccine financing, barcoding, training, and hesitancy.
