- Stabilizing the vaccine safety system
- Providing assistance to state and local health departments
- Safeguarding insurance coverage
- Continuing the flow of data for decision-making



The Vaccine Integrity Project

Providing trusted, science-based information to empower individuals, families, communities, clinicians, and policymakers to make informed vaccine choices.

- Focus: Scientific evidence available to evaluate the safety and effectiveness of current (and new) immunizations
- Purpose: Communicate, both proactively and reactively, available evidence around immunizations and vaccine preventable diseases
- Audience: healthcare providers, professional medical societies, health systems, public health, insurers/payors, media, policy makers, and the public at large

The Vaccine Integrity Project Piece of the Puzzle: Priority Focus Areas



- Summarizing and Disseminating Scientific Evidence:
 Continue to summarize and broadly share available science to support evidence-based immunization recommendations.
- Rapidly Communicating Information: Increase frequency, breadth, and depth of the communication around the safety and effectiveness of immunizations.
- Enhancing Collaboration and Visibility: Continue informal outreach to wide variety of organizations to improve coordination, reduce duplication, and identify and address emerging issues.


Summarizing and Disseminating Scientific Evidence
