Susan Farrall is a Public Health Advisor at the National Vaccine Program in the Office of Assistant Secretary of Health at the Department of Health and Human Services since November 2021. In this position, she works to develop national plans and policies that support immunization, as well as highlighting best practices that advance immunization equity. Previously, she worked for 18 years at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, with 13 years devoted to immunization programs and education, and 5 years devoted to public health emergency preparedness. While at the CDC, she was deployed for several public health emergencies, including Ebola assignments in Guinea and Democratic Republic of Congo, and assignments with COVID vaccine efforts for older adults. Her prior work experience has been as program manager of the tobacco control program at the DC Department of Health, project officer with JHPIEGO and the Pathfinder Fund for family planning projects in Turkey, Morocco, Senegal, Tunisia, and Jordan, national field organizer for the National Safe Kids Campaign and Peace Corps volunteers in Marrakech, Morocco working with children with disabilities. She has an MPH from Columbia University.
