About the Program

- ◆ The Phoenix Fire department's Baby Shots Program is an immunization program for adults and children who are uninsured and under insured
- ◆ The target populations are Kids Care, AHCCCS, Uninsured, Underinsured, and Native Americans. However, all populations are served at our community clinics
- ◆ The program is supported by:
 - ◆ A full-time program manager
 - ◆ Program Budget is supported by City of Phoenix General Budget allocation which includes: operations, logistics, and personnel staffing
 - ◆ United Healthcare Grant funds program in three-year increments and supports all facets of the program
 - ◆ Vaccines are sourced by VFA (Vaccine for Adult) and VFC (Vaccine for Children). Phoenix Fire partners with Maricopa County Public Health to ensure vaccine availability to our community

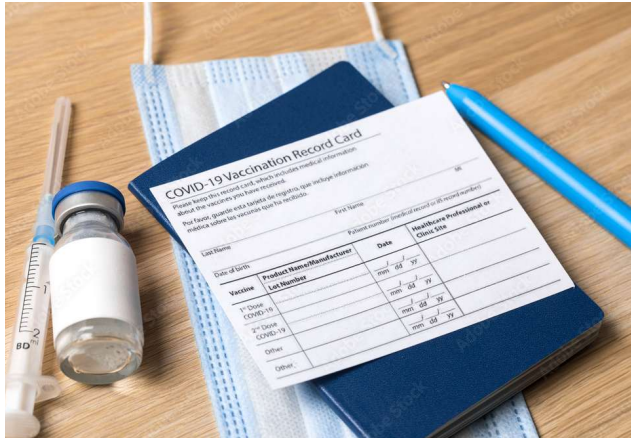

Mission

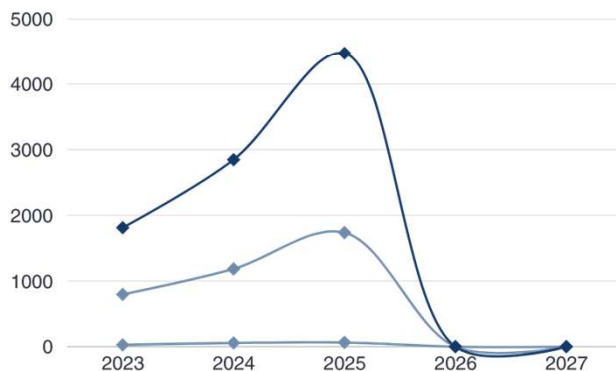
