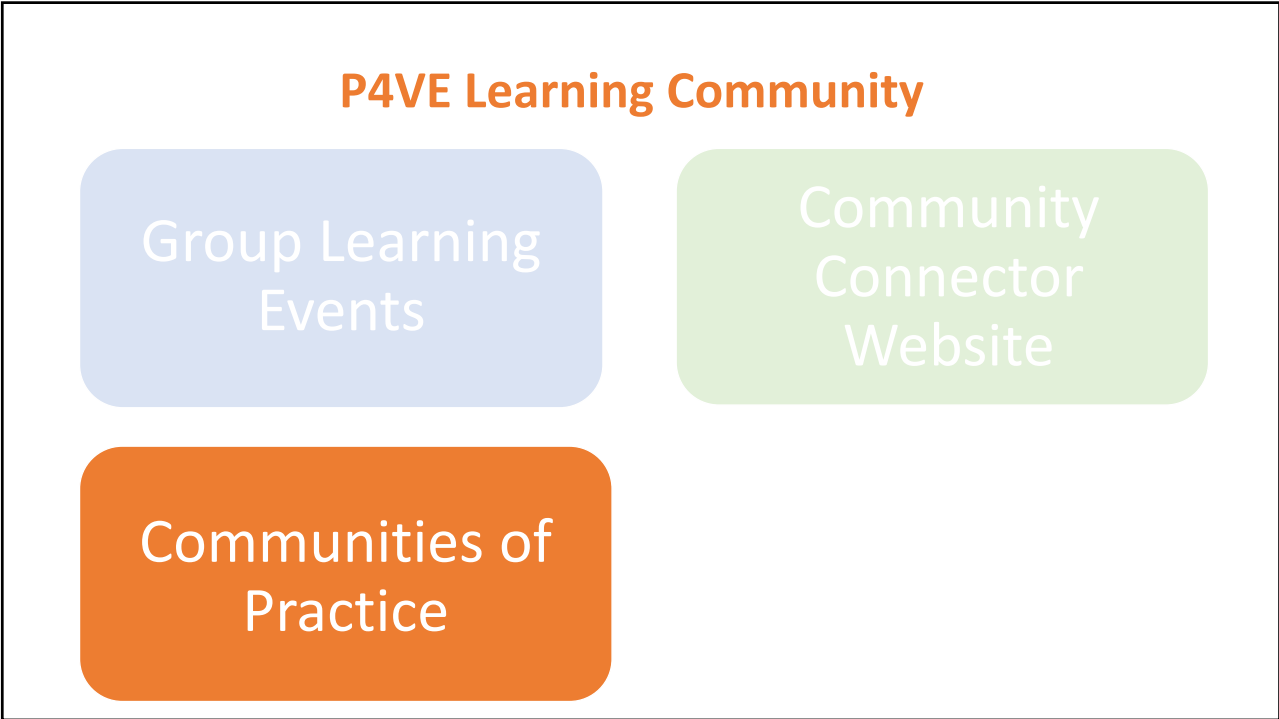
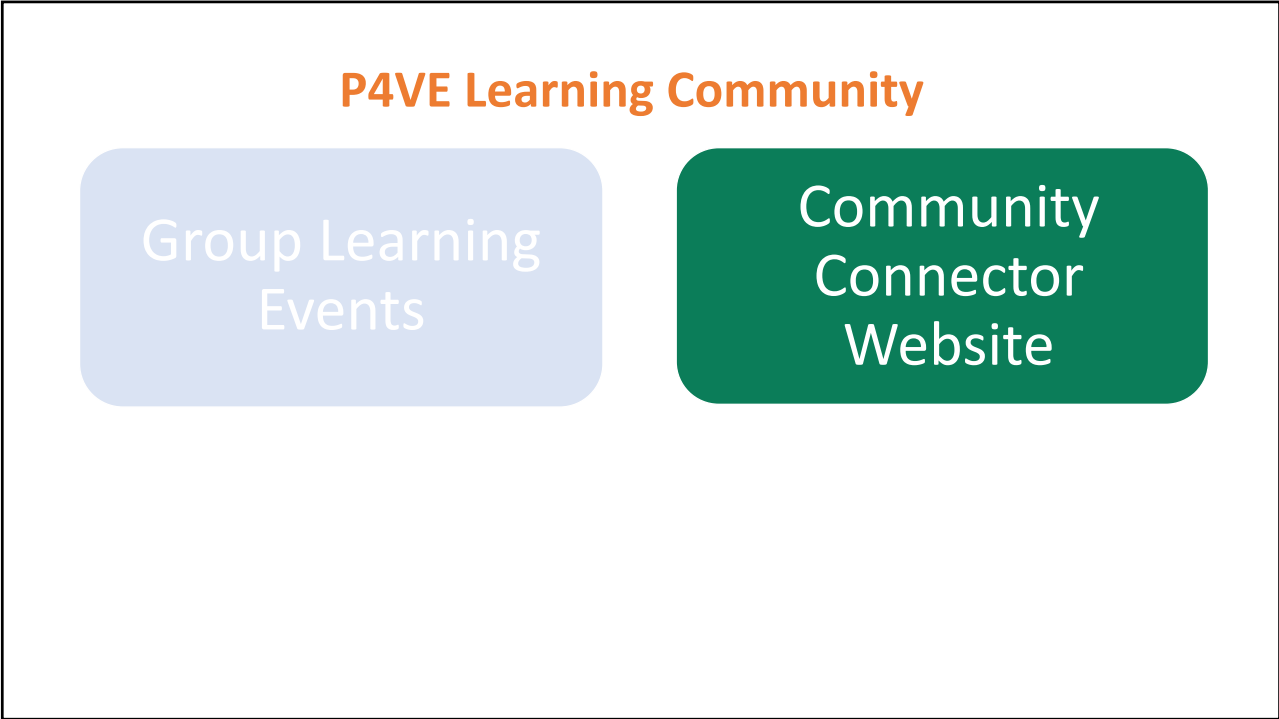
- Virtual listening session conducted in July 2020 with diverse leaders highlighted the importance of:
