Dr. John T. Brooks is an internist and clinical infectious diseases expert who normally serves as the Chief Medical Officer to the CDC's Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention where he coordinates the division's activities related to the national "Ending the HIV Epidemic" initiative. He served as the Chief Medical Officer the CDC's COVID-19 Response and is presently Chief Medical Officer for the CDC Monkeypox Response. Dr. Brooks has led teams during CDC emergency responses to anthrax, SARS, Ebola, and Zika. Dr. Brooks came to CDC as an EIS officer in 1998 after completing medical school, residency in internal medicine, and a fellowship in infectious diseases through Harvard Medical School.
