Chris Duggar works in Fort Collins, CO, for the U.S. Centers for Disease Control & Prevention. Since 2020 he has led CDC's Vaccine Distribution, Awardee, and Partner Support section for the COVID-19 Response in the Vaccine Task Force. Now he's doing the same with the Immunization Services Division.

Chris has served in several roles with the CDC including the National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases (NCIRD)'s Influenza Division, Acting Branch Chief for Global Health's Country Strategy and Implementation Branch, overseas as the CDC Deputy Country Director in Tbilisi, Georgia, and as the immunization program Public Health Advisor in Colorado. Prior to his field career, Chris worked with the Immunization Program, the National Stockpile, as well as the Influenza Division building local, national, and international public health capacity. As a graduate of the Presidential Management Fellowship Chris has worked not only with CDC but also the Food & Drug Administration, HHS, DOD, and collaborated with multiple government partners.

Prior to his government service, Chris worked for the Carter Center on their guinea worm eradication program and served with the U.S. Peace Corps for two years as a Community Health Worker in Togo, West Africa. Chris spent six years in the U.S. ARMY – Louisiana National Guard while earning his Bachelor of Science degree in Louisiana State University. Chris holds a master's degree in Public Health from Emory University.
