CAPT Sarah Schillie is the Education Team Lead within CDC's Immunization Services Division (ISD) and is currently serving as the Acting Branch Chief for the Proposed Health Education and Communication Branch within ISD. She is a graduate of the University of Missouri School of Medicine and completed her pediatrics residency at Pennsylvania State University and her preventive medicine residency at SUNY-Stony Brook. She received her MPH from Columbia University and her MBA from Long Island University. CAPT Schillie has been with CDC since 2007, when she joined as an Epidemic Intelligence Service Officer. Prior to that, she served as the Director of Performance Improvement for the Suffolk County Department of Health Services in New York.

CAPT Schillie developed guidance for ensuring Hepatitis B protection for healthcare personnel and for strengthening Hepatitis B vaccine birth dose recommendations. She serves as the senior editor of *Epidemiology and Prevention of Vaccine-Preventable Diseases*, also known as the "Pink Book."
